

FOOD PANTRY VS FOOD BANK

What's the difference?

A FOOD BANK

is an organization that collects items, inventories and stores it, and distributes it to food pantries that distribute to individuals in need. Food banks allow food pantries to obtain nutritious food at low cost in the quantities they need for their clients.

A FOOD PANTRY

is an individual site that distributes boxes of food directly to those in need in a specified area. A food pantry is a member agency of, and obtains food from, a food bank.
